


Completing a Turkey Hunt Reporting Form

Relevant Goal Paths (Spirit-Vision):



Rationale: Learners on the Employment and Independence Goal Paths will be required to interpret documents to locate specific details and to fill in a simple form. Further, learners on the Postsecondary and Secondary School Goal Paths often supplement their funding/income with seasonal employment, such as being a hunt and fish guide. In Ontario, each gun hunter must pass both the Canadian Firearms Safety Course exam and the Ontario Hunter Education Course exam.




Learning Plan Link (Heart- Feeling):

Hunt and fish guides often help their clients fill in the forms required by Ontario law. In providing assistance with these forms, guides create an improved customer service experience for the vacationer – and repeat business.

Task-Based Activity Description:

Learners will read a Turkey Harvest Reporting Worksheet to locate specific details and enter them into a form.



Activity Introduction

Explain to the learner that, in Ontario, it is mandatory to complete certain forms when hunting. This task-based activity is for employees to learn about being a Hunting and Fishing Guide and how to extract the necessary information to place in a form to assist customers.

Mandatory reporting of harvested turkeys is necessary by successful turkey hunters no later than 12:00 noon the day after the bird was harvested Form: <u>http://www.mnr.gov.on.ca/en/Business/OC/2ColumnSubPage/STDPROD_095049.html</u>

Mandatory Turkey Harvest Reporting Worksheet

Fill in the worksheet before you call, and have a pen or pencil and your licence available so you can record your confirmation number once your report is complete. The illustrations to the right of the page have been provided to assist you in collecting important biological information from your bird. This information will be requested as part of your report.

CELL PHONE USERS: A common reason why hunters are unable to complete telephone reports is a poor cellular connection. You have until no later than 12:00 noon the day after the bird was harvested to report your harvest. Please wait until you receive a clear, strong signal before placing your call.

- STEP 1 Call toll-free **1-800-288-1155**. When the system prompts you, use the keypad of your telephone to select the Turkey Harvest Reporting option.
- STEP 2 Record your Outdoors Card number below or have your card available when you make the call. After the prompt, enter the 15 digits of your Outdoors Card. Your Outdoors Card Number is:



STEP 3 What WMU did the harvest occur in? Only the valid WMUs listed on page 31 will be accepted.




STEP 4 How many days did you hunt in that WMU before harvesting a turkey? (NOTE: Report one day for each separate date you hunted in that WMU.)

STEP 5 Was the turkey a male or female (Figure 1)? ____

PLEASE NOTE: Only bearded turkeys are legal during the spring season. Any turkey is legal in the fall season.

- STEP 6 Was the turkey an adult or juvenile (Figure 2)?
- **STEP 7** How long was the longer spur (Figure 3)? Indicate the following: no spur; spur less than one-half inch or 13 millimetres; spur is one-half inch (13 millimetres) to less than one inch (25 millimetres); or spur is greater than or equal to one inch or 25 millimetres.
- STEP 8 Record your confirmation number in the space below and keep it as your record of having reported.

Figure 1: Determining the Sex of the Turkey



Male breast feathers are black tipped.


Female breast feathers have an outer edge of brown or tan.

Figure 2: Determining the Age of the Turkey



The leading wing feathers of **adults** have white barring to the tip, and the tip is usually rounded. The leading wing feathers of **juveniles** are not barred to the tip, and are generally pointed.

Figure 3: Measuring Spur Length



The spurs must be measured from the base of the spur to the tip along the bottom curve. A flexible tape or ruler provides a more accurate measurement.
